



## JSAF Enoshima Olympic Week 2011 Sailing Instructions (SI)

### 1. Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the ‘rules’ as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2009-2012 (RRS) except that was changed in this Sailing Instructions (SI).
- 1.2 If there is a conflict between rules, the Sailing Instructions will prevail.
- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

### 2. Notices to competitors

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at the regatta office.

### 3. Changes to sailing instructions

- 3.1 Any change to the SI will be posted at the regatta office 60 minutes before the first warning signal on the day it will take effect.
- 3.2 Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 on the day before it will take effect.

### 4. Signal made ashore

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at a flagpole located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor terrace of the club house.
- 4.2 Flag D with one sound means ‘The warning signal will be made not less than 40 minutes after flag D is displayed. Boats are requested not to leave the harbor until this signal is made.’
- 4.3 Flag AP will not be displayed for each race described in SI 5.2. Unless flag D is displayed, the start of the race is postponed for no established period.
- 4.4 When flag Y is displayed ashore with one sound, rule 40 applies at all times while afloat. This changes rule the Part 4 preamble.

The race committee may add one extra race per day due to the weather conditions.

5.3 To alert boats that a race or sequence of races will begin soon, an orange flag will be displayed with one sound for at least 4 minutes before a warning signal is displayed.

5.4 On the last day of the regatta no warning signal for each class will be made after 1400.

## 7. Racing Area

7.1 The races will be sailed in Racing Area A, B1, B2 and C, vicinity of Enoshima Yacht Harbor. See the attached Diagram-1.

7.2 Due to the weather conditions and so on the racing areas may be changed.


## 8. The courses

8.1 The following diagrams show the courses, including the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.


8.2 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat will display a flag that indicates the course to be sailed and the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

The courses to be sailed by 470, Snipe, 420, Laser, Laser radial and Laser 4.7 are as follows:


**Course 1:** Start -1-2-3-2-3- Finish  
Pennant 1




**Course 2:** Start -1-4-1-2-3- Finish

Pennant 3




**Course 4:** Start-1-4-1-4-Finish

## 9. Marks

9.1 470, Snipe, 420, Laser, Laser radial, Laser 4.7 classes

(a) Mark 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be cylindrical inflated orange buoys.

(b) The starting mark and the outside starting mark will be the race committee boats displaying an orange flag.

(c) The finishing mark will be a race committee boat, and the outside finishing mark will be a thin cylindrical inflated yellow buoy.

9.2 49er and Moth classes

(a) Mark 1 will be a cylindrical inflated orange buoy.

(b) The starting mark will be a race committee boat displaying an orange flag and the outside starting mark will be a thin cylindrical inflated yellow buoy.

(c) The finishing mark will be a race committee boat, and the outside finishing mark will be a cylindrical inflated yellow buoy.

## 10. The start

10.1 Races will be started by using SI5.2 and rule 26 with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal.

10.2 The starting line will be between a staff or a mast displaying an orange flag on the starting mark at the starboard end and a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting outside mark.

10.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.

10.4 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored **DNS** (Did Not Start) without a hearing. This changes rule A4.

10.5 Any race committee boats other than the race committee signal boat may display the First Substitute in order to notify competitors of a general recall, except that no sound is made on this boat. Removing the First Substitute on this boat does not mean 'a new start for recalled class shall be made one minute after that' in the race signal.

## 11. Change of the next leg of the course

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark and remove the original mark as soon as possible. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

---

## 12. Areas that are obstructions

The following areas are designated as obstructions: Diving spots around 50 meters from Japanese old fashioned fishing boats that display flag A.

---

**13. The finish**

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the finishing mark boat of the RC and the finishing outside mark.

---

**14. Penalty**

14.1 Appendix P will apply for a boat breaking rule 42.

14.2 A boat that breaks SI 19 may be recorded by the race committee as PTP without a hearing and given the point written in the SI 14.4. This changes rule 63.1 and A5.

14.3 The number of boats entered this regatta is that of admitted to enter this regatta.

14.4 A boat that was disqualified and so on shall be scored points using abbreviations as follows. This changes rule A4.2 and A5.

DNC	Did not come to the starting area	The number of boats entered + 1
DNS	Did not start (other than DNC OCS)	The number of boats entered + 1
OCS	On the course side of the starting line at her starting signal and broke rule 29.1 or 30.1	The number of boats entered + 1
ZFP	20% penalty under rule 30.2	The number of places + 20% of the number of boats entered that shall be the whole number. However she shall not be scored worse than DNF.
BFD	Disqualification under rule 30.3	The number of boats entered + 3
DNF	Did not finish	The number of boats entered + 1
RAF	Retired after finishing	The number of boats entered + 1
DSQ	Disqualification	The number of boats entered + 3
DNE	Disqualification not excludable under rule 90.3(b)	The number of boats entered + 3
PTP	Infringe the procedure of check-out/in Infringes the check-in: the first race of the day Infringes the check-out: the last race of the day	Either of smaller, the finishing order +5 or the number of boats entered + 3

**15. Time limits and target times**

15.1 The time limit for rounding Mark 1 and target time will be as follows:

Class	Time limit for Mark-1	Target time
49er	15 minutes	25 minutes
470 and Laser	20 minutes	40 minutes
Snipe, 420, Laser Radial and 4.7	20 minutes	45 minutes
Moth	15 minutes	30 minutes

15.2 If no boat has passed Mark-1 within the above time limit, the race will be abandoned.

Failure to meet the target time will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

15.3 Boats failing to finish within 12 minutes after the first boat of each class sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF (Did Not Finish) without a hearing. This changes rule 35, A4 and A5.

---

**16. Protests and requests for redress**

16.1 Protest forms are available at the regatta office. Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.

16.2 The protest time limit of each class is 60 minutes after the last race of the day is completed. It will be posted on the official notice board. The same time limit will apply for all protests and requests for redress by the race committee, international jury or protest committee. This changes rule 61.3 and 62.2.

- 16.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the protest room, located at the third floor, beginning at the time posted.
- 16.4 Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b) before the protest time limit.
- 16.5 A list of boats that, under instruction 14.1 have been penalized for breaking rule 42 will be posted.
- 16.6 Breaches of instructions 4.3, 14.2, 18, 19, 20, 22, 23, 24 and 27 will not be grounds for a protest or redress by a boat. This changes rule 60.1(a). Penalties for these breaches may be less than disqualification if an international jury or the protest committee so decides. The scoring abbreviation for a discretionary penalty imposed under this instruction will be DPI.
- 16.7 On the last scheduled day of racing a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered
- within the protest time limit if the requesting party was informed of the decision on the previous day;
  - no later than 30 minutes after the requesting party was informed of the decision on that day.
- This changes rule 66.
- 16.8 A request for redress based on an international jury or a protest committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes rule 62.2.
- 16.9 The hearing for an Olympic class will be done by an international jury, and that for other classes will be done by the protest committee.

## 17. Scoring

- 17.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A and instruction 14.4 will apply.
- 17.2 The following numbers of races are required to be completed to constitute the regatta.

- 17.3 (a) When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- (b) When from 5 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- (c) When 8 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

## 18. Safety regulations

- 18.1 Check-in/Check-out
- A skipper shall sign for each boat in the check-in form prepared in the regatta office every time she leaves the harbour. Check-in is accepted 60 minutes before the first warning signal of the day. When she leaves again after returning to the harbour she shall also sign in the check-in form.
  - A skipper shall sign for each boat in the check-out form prepared in the regatta office every time she returns there except for temporary return for recovery and so on. Check-out is accepted no later than 45 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.
- 18.2 A boat retired from a race but not for penalty reason shall deliver the retirement report at the regatta office as soon as she returns. If possible she shall notify the race committee before leaving the racing area.

## 19. Replacement of crew or equipment

- 19.1 Substitution of the competitors will not be allowed without prior written approvals of the race committee.
- 19.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorized by the race committee. Requests for substitution shall be delivered to the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.

**20. Equipment and measurement checks** A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rule, notice of race and sailing instruction.

**21. Official boats** An official boat of race committee will display the following flag.

The race committee signal boat

JSAF flag

A race committee boat

KASF flag

An international jury and a protest committee boat

‘JURY’ flag  
(Black letters in a white flag)



---

**22. Support boat**

22.1 Support and coach boats shall register at the regatta office each day no later than 60 minutes before the first warning signal of the day.

22.2 Support and coach boats shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first starting race until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

22.3 When a boat breaks the instruction 18.1 or 18.2, all boats related to crews who are on the boat may be penalized.

22.4 When a red cross flag is displayed on a race committee signal boat or a race committee boat that means ‘In all areas including a racing one every support and coach boat shall rescue a boat in danger immediately as soon as possible.’

22.5 When a supporting boat or person breaks rule 69 during this regatta, every related boat may be penalized.

**23. Trash disposal** Competitor’s and support boats shall not put trash in the water.

---

**24. Radio communication** Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

---

**25. Prize**

25.1 The prizes will be awarded according to the number of entries for each class.

25.2 All Japan 49er class championship  
Japan 49er Class Association will recommend 1<sup>st</sup> winner of this regatta to JSAF Olympic special committee as a member of the national team of 2011.

25.3 National Selection Race for 470 Junior World Championship 2012  
The rights to participate in the junior world championship 2012 are given to the 1<sup>st</sup> winner of each gender except for who already got the right in Wakayama International Regatta 2011.

25.4 National Selection Race for World Laser Championship 2012  
The details of national team selection shall be referred to the policy of national team selection for all Laser classes 2012.

25.5 East Japan 420 Class Championship 2011

- 1<sup>st</sup> winner will be honored as the east Japan champion and with the Cup of Kikuhomare and a certificate.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> winner will be honored with a certificate.
- The rights to participate in 420 class world championship 2012 are given to the 1<sup>st</sup> winner of each gender

25.6 East Japan 420 Class Championship 2011  
1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> winner will be honored with a trophy.

---

**26. Disclaimer of liability**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority and/or any party, person involved in this organization will accept no liability whatever for any personal material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

---

**27. Insurance**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party and herself liability insurance.
